The Garden at Church Meadows is Enjoying a Bountiful Season

As the growing season winds down, we're thrilled to share that nearly 1,775 pounds of fresh produce have been delivered to Loaves & Fishes Food Pantry—a true testament to the power of community and care.

All **100 tomato plants** were generously donated by individuals and local farms, and they've produced a stunning variety of tomatoes that are *still* being harvested! We're also looking forward to gathering a bountiful crop of **butternut squash** before the end of September.

Here's a snapshot of one of our beautiful one-day harvests—just a glimpse of the love and labor that goes into this mission.



The clients at Loaves & Fishes are deeply grateful for the fresh, nutritious food. In fact, the pantry welcomed **350 new families** this past year—the highest number in its **42-year history**. The need is greater than ever, and your support plays a vital role in helping feed our neighbors.

Important Update from the Finance Team

Dear Church Family,

We're reaching out with an important update regarding our church's budget and inviting your prayerful participation.

Earlier this year, our congregation approved a very lean budget with a projected deficit of just over \$16,000. Based on current giving trends, we anticipate a carryover deficit into 2026 unless additional support is received.

Why Your Support Matters

Our ministries — including worship, children's programs, pastoral care, outreach, and building maintenance — all depend on a balanced operating budget. Closing this gap ensures we can continue to meet our commitments to staff compensation, utilities, outreach, and mission support without interruption.

A Special Welcome from Our Children



Sarah currently serves on the Board of Directors of the Central Massachusetts Association of the Southern New England Conference of the UCC.



Council Update Sept 11, 2025

Rev. Jen opened with a reading, "The Blessing with Roots" by Father Killian McDonald, followed with prayer.

Pete Scantlebury reported on the many activities and repairs he and the Property Committee have accomplished. The ramp built for John Hutchins has been removed because his home has been sold and the lumber has been saved behind the church. Pete thanked all who helped disassemble it. Mass Save has done great work at little cost to install extra insulation and e-vents to the church. The temporary repair work done to the spire is holding. Quotes for permanent repairs or replacement are being gathered. Small group meetings will be held to explain plans and costs to the congregation. Clean-up is ongoing at the retention pond next to the parking lot. The church furnace needs a tune-up and valves replaced. The furnace is reaching the end of its lifespan and will have to be replaced at some point. Because the Mitsubishi system in the Sunday School area was not properly installed there is some sort of leak in the system. Larry Wenz is working to find a reliable contractor to address the issue.

Kathy Keenan spoke for the Finance Committee to report that pledging is on target at 66.6% budgeted. Unfortunately, Property expenses are over budget. Music and Stewardship will use up their entire budget. The Finance Committee is hoping that committees can cut back on some expenses. The various special collections have not reached the goals that were set, and the Committee hopes that the Christmas special offering will reach or even exceed its goal. The budget may be in deficit at year-end. Tricia Prescott is stepping down as Church Collector, so Rev. Jen asked Council members to think about someone for the position. An outside auditor has been confirmed. The budget sheets for the next calendar year will be sent out at the end of September and are due back December 1.

Now that the church is using SharePoint, Teams meetings instead of Zoom meetings are saving the church \$600 a year. Poliana Yee will set up the meetings for us.

The AED and cabinet are ready for installation. The Property Committee will work on where and when to install it. After installation, instructions on its use will be explained to all who are interested.

Susan Janes has been looking at plaques or "giving trees" to display and honor the Memorial Gifts given to the church. Some of those ideas come at quite a cost and she is trying to figure out how the church can afford to make it possible.


The Welcoming Committee has asked Deb Austerman and Sarah Nastasia to supply lists of families who have recently moved within a 5-mile radius of the church. Postcards will be sent to them telling them about our church.

Brad Austin told the Council that the theme for Stewardship this fall is "Together With". Inspiration Sunday is October 26 and Consecration Sunday is November 16. Between those two dates there will be interactive activities.

Deb Rosson announced that there will be a tearoom outing at Vintage Tea and Cake in Lexington on November 1.

Rev. Jen will soon be voted in as Moderator of the Central Association of the UCC. Jen spoke about the fact that the Nominating Committee is small and two long term members are hoping to step down. To help the Committee encourage church members to serve on the various committees, Rev. Jen asked that each committee submit by the November Council meeting a one-page description of what the committee actually does, when it is most busy, and any other points that Nominating can use in a "sales pitch".

Brad Hamilton closed the meeting with prayer.

Fall is the perfect time to refresh your wardrobe and clear out your closets! We're collecting gently used items for the upcoming **Rummage Sale**, including:






Harvest Fair Craft Nights - All Are Welcome!
