A Season of Abundance in the Garden

What a year it's been! In our 18th growing season, we're thrilled to share that **2,103 pounds** of fresh produce were donated to **Loaves & Fishes Food Pantry** at Devens. That brings our **grand total to over 35,000 pounds**—an incredible milestone made possible by your generosity and dedication. Wow!

Our mission remains the same: God's work on God's land—a true labor of love. Each year, we rely on the kindness of those who donate seeds, plants, time, and energy. This year, we're especially grateful to Theo's Market Garden, who stepped in to provide what Cataldo's once did—and they've already committed to donating again next year! Thanks to many generous individuals, we also planted a record-breaking 100 tomato plants!

A heartfelt thank you goes out to every volunteer who helped prepare the garden with fabric mulch, planted, fertilized, watered, weeded, harvested, delivered, and finally tucked the garden in for the winter. Our growing season runs from early May to mid-October, and many of you showed up again and again. Whether you came once or many times, your hands made this ministry flourish.

The staff at Loaves & Fishes continues to express deep gratitude for the fresh produce. This year, they welcomed **350 new families**—the highest number in their 40+ year history. The need is greater than ever, and your efforts are making a real difference.

This life-saving device is now available in case of emergency. Please do not open or tamper with the cabinet unless there is an emergency, as the alarm is active.

The AED is user-friendly and includes voice prompts, but we strongly recommend taking a CPR/AED training course to be fully prepared.







Council Update Oct 9, 2025

Rev. Sarah Hubbell, our pastor while Rev. Jen is on sabbatical, opened the meeting with prayer.

Pete Scantlebury spoke for the Property Committee about several projects the Committee is working on. Cataldo snowplowing is increasing by 4% and the committee is looking at other companies. Work is being undertaken on the Mitsubishi system to find a leak that has been happening because it was not installed properly. The fire extinguishers were inspected and recharged, and the Fire Department completed their inspection of the church. The defibrillator has been installed in the Parish Hall and Jim Cahill is coordinating training. Larry Wenz has been cleaning up the south perimeter of the church grounds and has refinished the deck. Due to mice damage, the dishwasher at the parsonage has been replaced. The Committee is working to control costs for the budget.

Kathy Keenan summarized the Finance Committee report. Income is at 83.7%. Pledging is on target at 76.1%. We have had 10 families fulfill their pledges for this year and 22 families donated but did not fill out a pledge card, which goes towards the \$10,000 in extra income that was budgeted. We are at about 60% of the \$10,000. One family donated directly to the deficit. Various successful events have contributed to the church income. We celebrate a net gain on investments of \$133,175! Collector tasks are being shared by several people, and they are looking for a volunteer for back up.

The Steeple Working Group spoke to small group meetings with 40 participants. The Wednesday evening meeting was recorded and should soon be available for folks to watch. Some of the questions posed by the participants include: How long will the repair last? What will the final quotes be? How will payment terms be defined? What kind of materials will be used and how long will they last? The next meeting concerning the steeple plans will be in November.

Deb Rosson announced that the Garden at Church Meadows has sent a total of 2035 pounds to Loaves and Fishes! She thanked Rev. Hubbell for officiating at the closing of the garden. Deb also gave Sandy Clyde kudos for all she handled while Poliana Yee was away with her family on the death of her father and spoke of sympathy for Poliana.

Rev. Hubbell spoke to the Council about her background and told Council members she is glad to be here at CCoL. She closed the meeting with prayer.

January 5 (by 9AM)

All pledge income intended for 2025 must be received by this time to be applied to the 2025 giving year. Any donations received after this date will be credited to 2026.
